Workshops and Residencies

The Carnegie provides workshops and residencies directly to the classroom. Each program is designed to allow the students an opportunity to connect, create, perform/produce, and respond. They focus on combining the elements of dance, theatre, or visual arts with other non-arts related content areas to strengthen creativity, problem solving, perseverance, communication, and pride.

Goals of the Programming

- Create an atmosphere where students can take creative risks and practice decision making.
- Reinforce positive behavior & social skills by developing an atmosphere of teamwork, respect, and pride.
- Improve content knowledge with engaging, hands-on experiences.
- Enhance the desire to learn and make an impact on the community.

All programs align with the National Core Arts Standards.

Students will **actively involved in:**

- making choices in the creation of artworks
- creating, improvising, and performing works alone and with others

Students will **use knowledge of:**

- elements of art and principles of design and a variety of processes in creating artworks
- elements of drama or dance to create and perform dramatic works in an expressive manner
- elements and terminology to describe and/or critique their own performance and the performances of others

Classroom support and follow-up activities: Classroom teachers will be asked to be active participants in the programs. They will be given suggestions on how to continue with live performances or presentations in their classroom. They will also be provided with feedback tools to assess student learning and enhance classroom discussion.

Examples of In-School Programs

Theatre 10 Day Programs

2nd - 5th

Fables with a Twist Retell fables with your own twist. Students will collectively create and perform their version of a well-known fable in their own voice.

Connections: Language Arts

4th - 8th

Adventures of an Underdog Share the heroic journey of an underdog. Students will collectively create and perform a story about a character struggling to overcome great odds.

Connections: Language Arts

4th - 8th

A Villain's Tale Tell the story through the eyes of the villain. Students explore misunderstandings and decisions gone wrong as they create and perform the villain's side of the story.

Connections: Theatre & Language Arts

4th - 8th

Hidden Stories Analyze a painting and bring its story to life. Students examine and interpret paintings to develop into new stories to be performed live.

Personify It! (NEW) Anything can be a character with personification. Students will test their creativity as they uncover the secret endeavors of non-human characters live.

Theatre 2 Day Programs

K - 2nd

Tradition Tableau Create tableaux communicating favorite family traditions. Students will demonstrate their understanding of the many emotions of tradition through non-verbal expression.

Connections: Social Studies

K - 2nd

Painting Soundscape (NEW) Set the scene with the sounds of the environment. Students will practice interpreting the setting in a painting and creating the opening to a scene.

Connections: Visual Arts

1st - 3rd

Occupation Drama Explore character transformation by stepping into the shoes of a working citizen. Students will create mini scenes demonstrating how occupations impact people in our community.

Connections: Social Studies

3rd - 5th

Oddball Superheroes Explore character transformation with the quirkier side of superheroes. Students will practice action/reaction scenes and discover how actors use adverbs to develop unique characters.

Connections: Language Arts

3rd - 5th

Another's Perspective Step into the shoes of a supporting character in a story. Students will express another's perspective by developing the voice of a supporting character.

Connections: Language Arts

3rd - 5th

Consequences Pantomime Students will explore action/reaction as they create a short, pantomimed scene demonstrating natural and enforced consequences.

Connections: Theatre & Social Studies

4th - 8th

Inner Voice Share the inner thoughts of an unexpected character. Students will explore personification and character voice to express the thoughts of an object or concept.

Connections: Science

4th - 8th

Comic Book Tableau (NEW) Students will practice using a series of tableaux to communicate a sequence. This program can tie to any subject that demonstrates story sequence or cause and effect.

Dance 2 Day Programs

K - 2nd

Many Colored Days Bring Dr. Seuss's My Many Colored Days to life through dance. Students will use dance elements to express the colors, emotions, and characters in the book.

Connections: Language Arts

K - 2nd

Dance the Setting Communicate the setting of a story through dance. Students will use dance elements to express different environments.

Connections: Language Arts

1st - 2nd

Opposites (NEW) Create a dance demonstrating opposites. Students will use dance elements to express the differences in two contradicting words.

Connections: Language Arts

1st - 3rd

Object Dance Explore force and motion through dance. Students will use dance elements to express pushes and pulls on objects.

3rd - 5th

The Water Dance Dance the water cycle. Students will use dance elements to interpret the water cycle

Environments Explore environments from around the world through dance. Students will use dance elements to express differing environments across the globe...and throughout the universe.

4th - 8th

Dance Mad Lib Create a dance inspired by a mad lib about your community. Students will work together to choreograph each blank until they have danced the whole story.

One Voice Communicate through dance how individual acts of bravery can impact a community. Students will use dance elements to express how one voice can be the spark that inspires many.

Visual Art 2 Day Programs

K - 2nd

Blob Monster Society Create a citizen of the Blob Monster Society. Using paint and marking tools, students will embellish their paint blobs to visually express a monster and its occupation.

K - 2nd

Character Headpieces Become a costume designer and build your own headpiece. Students will design and create a headpiece that expresses a character.

2nd - 3rd

Superhero Masks Students will design a superhero that will solve a community problem. They will create a mask that represents their brand new super hero.

3rd - 5th

Bang! Splat! (NEW) Explore and create onomatopoeia word art. Students will use visual arts elements to express the mood and meaning of the word.

Rare Bugs Design a new predator or prey for the insect world. Students will create a 3-D model of new bug and demonstrate how it survives in a healthy food chain.
Connections: Science

Gratitude Card Swap (NEW) Express your gratitude. Using poetic language and simple printmaking techniques, students will create one-of-a-kind thank you cards.

Treasure Map (NEW) Turn your ordinary surroundings into an exciting treasure hunt. Using visual elements, students will put their map making skills to the test to help guide classmates to the treasure.

Shadow Puppets Explore a unique way to tell stories with light, shadow and 2-d puppets. Construct shadow puppets to express your original stories or poems.

Inventions Become an inventor. Students will create and present a model of an invention designed to solve a community problem.
